2.	<u>Treasurer Report</u> Currently £1648.09 in the bank. Transferred £2,000 to Lets Looc (Learn Outside of the Classroom) for 35hrs working with some of our young people. Transferred £500 for the PE T-shirts. £120 belongs to ticket sales for forthcoming night out. £900 belongs to mental health grant.

Tracking tutorials are in place for where young people are under- achieving in particular subject areas. The plan is for the second week back after the October break, there will be a specific timetable created for young people in particular classes to engage in specific work with a specialist to try and get back on track and up to speed to where they need to be.	
This will be the first year trialling this beyond normal interventions currently in place. Still need to decide criteria – going to extended leadership team on Thursday to put out to ELT to look at who are we best to target, need focus on who and why. Essentially class teachers, subject specialists, will come out of BGE classes to target support in senior phase.	
Tomorrow is World Mental Health Day so we are doing a Wear It Yellow to try and raise funds for mental health and wellbeing resources. Credit to Mental Health ambassadors who have been really proactive over the recent period delivering at assemblies and a Parents Night. Very high profile. Well supported by Jacqui and Gordon.	
Collating, thanks to efforts of pupil leadership team, high level messages from S1 parents night. 70% uptake – highest ever of S1 parents and carers. A very positive night all round. £90 made by senior pupil's bake sale. Mental Health ambassadors present and MWOW ambassadors present. A few things raised – access to digital devices and google classroom. Once all information collated, LS will contact people individually and hear a bit more about challenges. Concerns on surveys will be followed up. A positive night. Seniors acted as support guides.	
Parents in Partnership ends this Friday with social subjects and maths. Been a positive few weeks so far.	
First family fun night this week, Halloween themed treasure hunt, arts and crafts, dooking for apples. Lindsay Cook, Sophie Merilees and John have designed a fun treasure hunt. Senior pupils will support that. Soup, bread and sweet treats available. 94 spaces booked so far. P6/7 also invited. This Wednesday, 430-6pm.

DG – food parcels available, welfare rights person will be attending and rep from families outside, who support families who have a family member in prison, as a drop in.	
LS advised a communication will be distributed re bringing in sweatshirts etc for badges, which will also be available on the night.	
Second parent conversation café this week, kicks off at 9.30am on Thursday. Last month was meet our Campus Police Officer PC Lewis, this month is meet our school nurses. 6 signed up at last count.	
Royal Recognition this week. JC – data has been pulled. Looking at attendance, late coming and number of merits retained (everyone gets one merit per period per day). Data is currently sitting with house teams to quality assure. Will be collated on Friday and text sent out to parents and carers on Friday and goes towards inter- house points as well at the end of term.	
Uniform – pizza party on Thursday afternoon for winning register classes from each year group which has upheld the most uniform points. Register teachers do a uniform mark every day.	
Week beginning 23 <sup>rd</sup> October is next family house time. Each house every month will select 10 young people – different criteria to streamline a little. Last one was first years to get to know them, next set are 100% attendance so far. This is on the back of school improvement plan pupil feedback, pupils asked for more time with house teams.	
LS also carried out a focus group of 10 young people and now for monthly HT excellence awards is bringing the young people down and presenting certificates with a drink and cake. Have reached quite a few different young people this term with some rich feedback – which will be on the agenda at the ELT on Thursday. Looking at strengths they have articulated and also challenges in first year. A lot saying the work is easy and more challenge is needed. Once unpicked it's not necessarily the case so needs to be put on the table for wider discussion.
